Additional Notes

- Restoration project tried to return the layout to its original design. Bunkers were rebuilt increasing from 69,000 sq. ft. to 170,000 sq. ft. Five greens were rebuilt using templates from other William Langford courses. All tee complexes were regrassed or rebuilt. Waterway on 16 green and 18 tee complex was changed. Tees on No. 18 were moved to the west side of the pond to create a more dramatic finishing hole.
- Area has had more than usual rain amounts, including large storm last week.
- Average fairway widths in landing areas are 42 yards.
