Additional Notes

- This is the 2nd year the tournament will be played in June after taking place in July 2021 and August 2022.

- Area had a mild winter which put the course ahead three weeks in the growing season compared to last year.

- The course did have flooding in late December with No. 15 green being submerged for 3 days. Other holes that flooded include 4, 7 and 11-16. The turf was not damaged when water receded in four days.

- Average fairway widths in landing areas are 30 yards.
