### **Notable**

- The 2022 renovation included moving or adding bunkers on every hole, greens dropped in elevation or pushed right or left on every hole, re-routing of No. 10 and No. 18 to play in opposite directions than before and forward tees added to provide seven tee placements on every hole.
- Course is built on land that used to be a pineapple farm.
- Honey is produced from the 12 bee hives on the course, bottled and given to membership, bartenders for drinks and chefs to cook with.
- Course is Audubon International and GEO certified.
- Wildlife on course includes birds, alligators, fox, raccoons and bees in the bee hives.
