Notable

- Fairways have been narrowed from last year to 30 yards.
- Prior to the 2024 tournament Johnston added a bunker in No.
 18 landing area.
- In 2023 more than 19" of rain fell during tournament week, but play was completed due to drainage infrastructure.
- Sentosa was the first golf club in the world to join the UN Climate Change Agreement in 2019 and to the best of their knowledge, the first in the world to achieve carbon neutrality in 2022.
