#### **Additional Notes**

- The property was a sod farm before the golf course was built.
- Spring work on the course included rebuilding and adding new sand in bunkers and expansion of professional tees on No. 6, 7, 9, 14, 17.
- Duininick Golf rebuilt half the bunkers while maintenance team repaired half after a September storm (7" of rain) washed out almost every bunker on the property.
- The 2018 renovation included narrowing of fairways, addition of bunkers and tees and repositioning tee complexes.
