- Entire course has been renovated since the last International in 2006 with help from Jack Nicklaus and Total Turf.
- Renovation included new bunkers, rebuilt tees and greens, renovated water features.
- A herd of 250 elk co-exist around the golf course. Other wildlife on the course include deer, bobcat, mountain lion, bear, bald eagles, hawks and of course hummingbirds.
