Notable

- Weather the month leading into the tournament has had warm sunny afternoons with no rainfall, which is odd this time of year. Course should be firm and fast.
- Since last year's tournament the 6th green was rebuilt, and 50+ trees were planted.
- After playing Torrey Pines at 7,765 yards last week, Pebble Beach measures 6,972 yards.
- Bachman was named the superintendent of the year by the Golf Course Superintendents Association of Northern California.
- Course will host the 2027 U.S. Open.

Notable

- December storms took out 30 trees including the featured Cypress in #16 fairway.
- #6 green complex was renovated in 2024 with the green expanded by 1,200 sq. ft. providing more pin locations in the front lobe and areas in the back left and back right of the green.
- Upgrade of irrigation system since last year.
- Added drainage in we areas on holes 1, 7, 10, 11, 14 and 18.

- In 2025 the #15 green complex will be rebuilt, and additional Cypress and Oak tree plantings will be added on the course.
- #8 green complex was rebuilt prior to the 2024 tournament.
- The course is said to be located where Robert Louis Stevenson got his inspiration for the famous novel Treasure Island.
- Every hold on the course was named after a significant place or character in the novel Treasure Island.
- Maintenance staff average tenure is 14.5 years at course.
- Tournament volunteers mostly consist of former employees and future turf managers who are finishing up their educations.
