Notable

- Area had coldest winter in many years.
- The last week of January featured 4" of snow and sleet (first snow on Hilton Head Island since January 2018). The course closed for a week.
- Typically, the non-overseeded bermuda fairways and roughs are greening up by mid-February, but not this year.
- A new irrigation system (1,800 sprinkler heads) and pump station was installed in 2024.
- Assistant superintendents Mark Lewis and Jordan Feathers were previously interns at Long Cove Club.
- Course hosted the men's mid-amateur in 1991 and the women's mid-amateur in 2003.
