Notable

- Course is on land that used to be a sugar cane farm.
- Since last year the rough on #4 was renovated, the waste areas on #15 were beautified and the entire practice facility was renovated and resurfaced to platinum paspalum.
- Also, a 7,000 square foot practice putting green was added along with a wiffle ball field and a bar.
- Course will undergo a tee renovation over the next two years, completing nine holes this spring and summer and the remaining nine holes in 2026.
- DiMase has been waiting on newly purchased equipment to arrive, so staff has been working with just two fairway mowers, five walk green mowers, three tee mowers and two rollers.
- Maintenance staff is a veteran staff who were mostly born and raised in Abaco.

- In November 2024, DiMase was called in to assist with the football field grow-in and set-up for the Bahamas Bowl college football game.
- DiMase was elected the inaugural president of the Caribbean superintendent chapter of the year in 2022.
- DiMase was named Syngenta's 2019 Superintendent of the Year.
